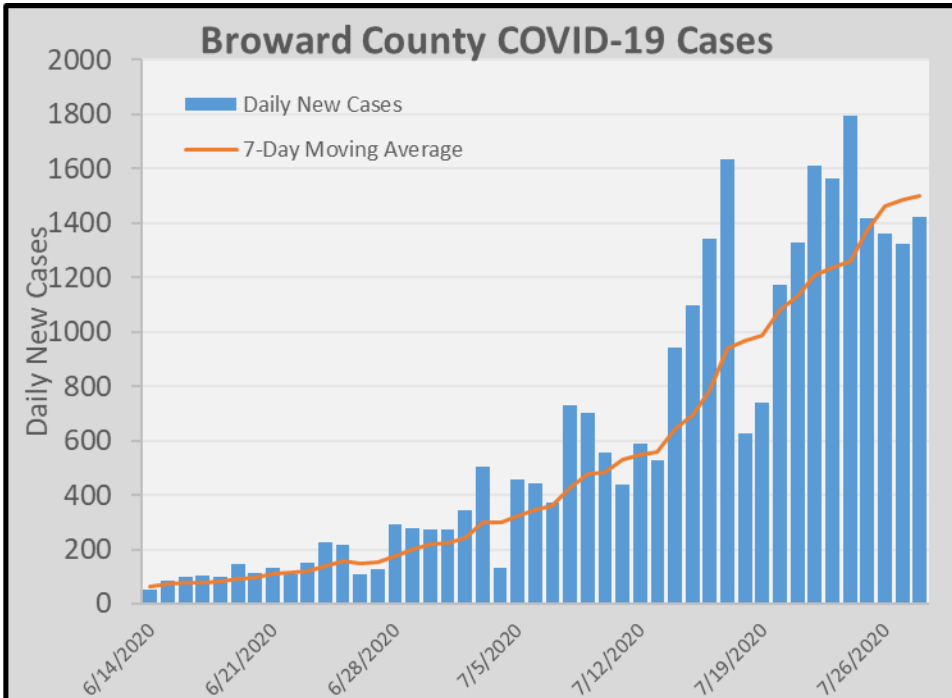
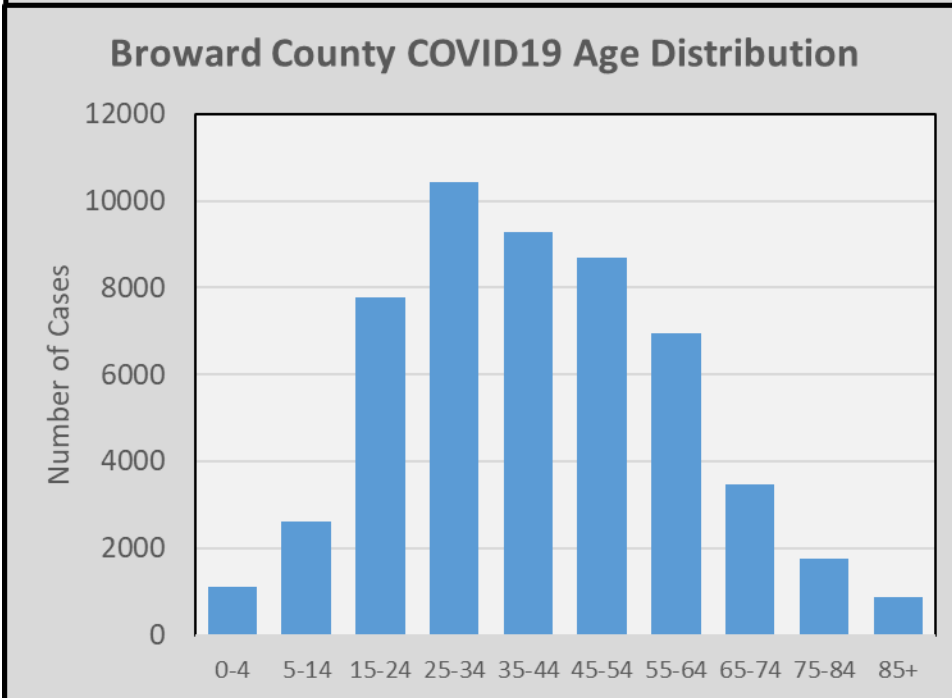

SUMMARY OF CURRENT ACTIONS

- The Broward County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) remains at Level 2 (Partial Activation) initiated at 12:00 PM, March 10, 2020.
- The EOC is monitoring Potential Tropical Storm Nine and evaluating additional activation and BERT staffing requirements should the storm continue to develop and threaten the region. Briefed our BERT and Municipal partners during conference calls on storm status and provided recommendations to plan for potential storm-related response and recovery activities.
- The Florida Department of Emergency Management, County, and federal government will be closing outdoor testing sites at the close of business on July 30, 2020 in preparation for potential impacts.
- The EOC is activated to support preparedness, response, and recovery activities as well as information sharing and situational awareness for the Coronavirus pandemic.

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- Situational Reports (SITREPS) are being distributed once a week on Wednesday.
- Conference call schedules are modified to be once a week on Wednesday. This is for both the Broward Emergency Response Team (12:15 PM) and Municipal Coordination (3:00 PM) calls.
- Temperature checks are being conducted at the EOC from 7:30 AM until 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday. Temperature checks on Saturday and Sunday are conducted from 7:30 AM until 2:30 PM.
- Activated EOC units include: Executive Policy Group, Unified Command Group, Liaison Officer, Public Information Officer (ESF14 Public Information), Operations Section Emergency Services Branch (ESF4 Firefighting, ESF16 Law Enforcement), Human Services Branch (ESF6 Mass Care, ESF8 Health and Medical), Infrastructure Branch (ESF1 Transportation: Port Everglades, FLL, Transit), ESF18 (Business and Industry), Logistics Section (ESF7 Resources Support including Procurement/Supply Unit, Mission Tracking Unit, and EOC Support Unit), Services Branch (ESF15 Volunteers and Donations), ESF11 (Food and Water), EDC, Planning Section (ESF5 Information and Planning: Documentation Unit and Situation Unit), and the Finance and Administration Section: Budget Unit, Personnel Branch Director, Finance Branch Director, Cost Unit, and Time Unit.

Broward County Update

- All Broward County Government offices currently remain open; however, to minimize employee exposure, the County remains closed to the public for non-essential elements of services.
- Broward County has launched a public-facing dashboard to receive complaints of businesses not following emergency guidelines.
- The COVID-19 hotline hours have been extended from 8:00 AM until 10:00 PM to increase availability for reports of business violations.

COVID-19 Screening Collection Sites

FDEM Sponsored Sites

- C.B. Smith Park – The site requires appointments. The reservation number is 954-276-4680 and is operated 7 days a week from 7:30 AM until 5:30 PM. Everyone who calls to register and meets the criteria for testing will be provided a confirmation number and a pre-packet will be waiting at the park for them when they arrive. Eligibility has expanded to include all South Florida residents 18 years or older, and all first responders and healthcare workers who are asymptomatic or symptomatic. Pediatric testing appointments will be on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday. All patients must bring an ID: driver's License, passport, or state issued ID (no pictures or photocopies). The site is operated by the Florida National Guard in cooperation with Memorial Healthcare Systems and the Florida Department of Health, at the direction of the Office of the Governor. **On July 28, 2020, 900 tests were administered.**
- City of Fort Lauderdale drive-through testing site at Holiday Park for individuals with no requirements; testing is provided for asymptomatic and symptomatic conditions. The hours are

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from 9:00 am until 6:00 pm, Tuesdays through Saturday. Call (800) 209-7191 to make an appointment which is required. **On July 28, 2020, 1,164 tests were administered.**

- City of Lauderdale – Lauderdale Sports Park; 7500 W Oakland Park Blvd, Lauderdale is open every day from 9:00 AM until 5:00 PM. No appointment is necessary, however you must be 18 and have a photo ID. **On July 28, 2020, 382 tests were administered.**
- City of Miramar’s walk-up testing site at the Miramar Youth Recreation Center, at 7000 Miramar Parkway is open every day from 9:00 AM until 2:00 PM. **On July 28, 2020, 501 tests were administered.**
- Sawgrass Mills Mall pop-up testing site at 12801 W. Sunrise Blvd, Sunrise is open every day from 9:00 AM until 5:00 PM. **On July 28, 2020, 202 tests were administered.**
- Publix at Coral Ridge located at 11600 W. Sample Road, Coral Springs, is open Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM until 5: PM. **On July 28, 2020, 266 tests were administered.**

DOH Sponsored Sites

- DOH-Broward walk-up testing sit at Mitchell Moore Park in Pompano Beach. This site is open from 9:00 AM until 6:00 PM every day except Thursday. Testing is available without an appointment. For general information and homebound testing appointments, call 954-412-7300. **On July 28, 2020, 471 tests were administered.**
- DOH-Broward walk-up site located at Lincoln Park – 600 NW 19th Avenue, Ft. Lauderdale. This site is operational from 9:00 AM until 6:00 PM Tuesday through Saturday to help service communities that may lack transportation opportunities. Testing is available for symptomatic individuals with no age requirement and is specifically geared towards residents living near the sites. This site no longer accepts appointments; testing in conducted on a first come-first served basis. For general information and homebound testing appointments, call 954-412-7300. **On July 28, 2020, 444 tests were administered.**
- DOH-Broward is conducting testing for those that meet criteria for public health testing. **On July 28, 2020, 135 tests were administered. To date 10,864 tests have been administered.**
- Broward County, the Florida Department of Health in Broward (FDOH-Broward), American Medical Response (AMR), and Century Ambulance Services (CAS) is operating a mobile/in-home testing program. Residents eligible for the new testing option include homebound elderly or individuals with disabilities who are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 and cannot leave their homes to access one of the drive-up or walk-up test collection sites. Hours of operation are from 9:00 AM until 12:00 PM and 1:00 PM until 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday. **On July 28, 2020, 91 tests were administered.**
- City of Coral Springs walk-up testing site at Mullins Park, located at 10000 Ben Geiger Drive, Coral Springs. Testing is by appointment only by calling (954) 412-7300. The site operates from 8:00 AM until 4:30 PM. **On July 28, 2020, 484 tests were administered.**

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- Deerfield Beach walk-up testing site at Oveta McKeithen Recreational Complex, located at 445 S.W. 2 Street, Deerfield Beach operates Monday through Saturday from 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM. On July 28, 2020, 620 tests were administered.
- Hollywood walk-up testing site at Boulevard Heights Community Center, located at 6770 Garfield Street, Hollywood is open Wednesday through Saturday from 9:00 AM until 3:00 PM. On July 28, 2020, when 592 tests were administered.
- City of Tamarac pop-up testing site at the Tamarac Recreation Center at 7531 N. University Drive, Tamarac is open Tuesday through Thursday from 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM. On July 28, 2020, 361 tests were administered.
- Markham Park pop-up testing site at 16001 W. State Road 84, Sunrise. The site is open Tuesday through Saturday, from 8:00 AM until 3:00 PM. On July 28, 2020, 494 tests were administered.
- Vista View Park pop-up testing site at 4001 SW 142nd Ave, Davie. The site is open Sunday through Thursday, from 8:00 AM until 4:00 PM. On July 28, 2020, 404 tests were administered.

Privately Sponsored Sites

- Cleveland Clinic drive-through collection site is operational Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM until 5:00 PM. Potential patients must call the Cleveland Clinic Florida appointment center at 954-659-5951 to schedule a test. Callers will be screened by a nurse who will determine whether the caller meets the federal testing criteria. On July 28, 2020, 74 tests were administered.
- Care Resource drive-through testing site is operational for individuals meeting Centers for Disease Control (CDC) criteria. Testing continues by appointment on Tuesdays and Thursdays. On July 28, 2020, 44 tests were administered.
- Broward Health drive-through testing at Annie L Weaver Health Center 2011 NW 3rd Avenue, Pompano Beach. Testing is by appointment only by calling (954) 320-5730. The site is open Monday through Saturday from 9:00 AM until 1:00 PM. On July 27, 2020, 31 tests were administered. Testing data for July 28, 2020 have not yet been reported.

Federal Sponsored Sites

- New drive-through testing site: Dillard High School at 2501 N.W. 11 Street, Ft. Lauderdale. This site opened July 24, 2020 and is operational every day from 8:00 AM until 6:00 PM and will test individuals 5 years of age and older, regardless of symptoms. Cost of testing is free, with or without insurance. Appointments and online registration are recommended. Appointments can be made at www.DoINeedACovid19Test.com. On July 28, 2020, 459 tests were administered.
- New drive-through testing site: Blanche Ely High School at 1201 N.W. 6 Avenue, Pompano Beach. This site opened July 24, 2020 and is operational every day from 8:00 AM until 6:00 PM and will test individuals 5 years of age and older, regardless of symptoms. Cost of testing is

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free, with or without insurance. Appointments and online registration are recommended. Appointments can be made at www.DoINeedACovid19Test.com. On July 28, 2020, 322 tests were administered.

- New drive-through testing site: MacArthur High School at 6501 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood. This site opened July 24, 2020 and is operational every day from 8:00 AM until 6:00 PM and will test individuals 5 years of age and older, regardless of symptoms. Cost of testing is free, with or without insurance. Appointments and online registration are recommended. Appointments can be made at www.DoINeedACovid19Test.com. On July 28, 2020, 438 tests were administered.

ESF8: Health and Medical

- Long-Term Care Facilities:
 - 1) Coordination between DOH-Broward, Incident Management Team, and the Agency for Healthcare Administration continues with regard to infection control and deployment of resources.
 - 2) LTCF resource requests continue to be submitted via the Healthcare Coalition process.
- DOH-Broward COVID-19 Call Center (954-357-9500):
 - 1) COVID-19 Call Center is operational from 8:00 AM until 10:00 PM seven days a week. There were 714 calls on July 28, 2020 and the total number of calls since March 4, 2020 is 93,919.
 - 2) The 311 Broward County Call Center continues to address general COVID-19 calls and refer to DOH-Broward Call Center as appropriate.

- EMS Coordination:
 - 1) Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) procedures continue.
 - 2) Names of long-term care facilities with Persons-Under-Investigation and/or positive individuals are being provided to EMS/Fire Rescue 24/7 via ESF8 and the EOC Duty Officer.

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- Provider Outreach:
 - 1) DOH-Broward continues to provide updated CDC guidance through blast email on a continuous basis to all licensed physicians, hospitals, urgent care centers, long-term care facilities, Hospital Institution Care Program, Broward County Medical Association (BCMA), and the Broward County Healthcare Coalition.
 - 2) DOH-Broward is providing 24/7 on-call epidemiology consultation to healthcare providers.
 - 3) Provider resource requests continue to be submitted via the Healthcare Coalition process.
 - 4) Telemedicine follow-up for individuals testing positive for COVID19 is being conducted by Memorial Health System, Holy Cross, Cleveland Clinic, Care Resource, and Community and Family Health Centers. Broward Health is exploring telemedicine follow-up for their clients. Care Resource and Community and Family Health Centers are providing follow-up for individuals testing positive for COVID19 via public health testing.
 - 5) DOH-Broward participates in Broward County Healthcare Coalition and Hospital calls for situational need and awareness.
- Community Outreach:
 - 1) Broadly disseminating self-screening information for COVID-19 flyer via social media.
 - 2) DOH-Broward participates in municipal and Broward Emergency Response Team calls for situational need and awareness.
 - 3) Working with Broward County and Urban League regarding case management and supportive isolation.
 - 4) Working with Broward County Homeless Initiative Partnership.
 - 5) Working with Broward County Child Care Licensing.
 - 6) Working with Agency for Persons with Disabilities.
- Safety:
 - 1) Monitoring Personal Protection Equipment supply and making requests when necessary.
 - 2) Identify, isolate, and inform protocols for CDC sites continues to be implemented for staff and clients.
 - 3) Monitoring civil unrest and adjusting testing sites' schedules in consultation with law enforcement and National Guard.

ESF6: Mass Care:

- Finalized shelter logistics plan for PPE and conducted a logistics meeting to address execution of the plan.

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- Conducted two 96 Hour Timeline calls related to the pending tropical system:
 - 1) Timeline call with the School Board of Broward County
 - 2) Timeline call with Broward County - EM Coordinators, Human Services Branch, ESF6 Table, ESF17 Table, and Shelter Managers
- A 72-Hour Timeline call with the same attendees is scheduled for 10:00 AM on July 30, 2020.
- Working to complete 33 General Population Shelter rosters.

ESF1: Transportation:

- The Port Everglades Harbormaster report of vessels that have submitted berth applications to arrive at the port on July 29, 2020 includes only cargo/container ships. The container ship MAERSK IDAHO remains in port under quarantine as approved by FDOH and the Port Everglades Unified Command.
- The U.S. Coast Guard has issued a Marine Safety Information Bulletin (MSIB 20-010) for Tropical Development Nine and set the Weather Advisory to Port Condition Whiskey. At this time, waterfront facilities should remove potential flying debris and hazards from dockside areas and container stacking plans should be implemented.
- The airport (FLL) is open and operational. Due to flight level reductions, portions of terminal concourses are temporarily closed until further notice. The travel ban from Brazil for non-US citizens and non-permanent residents is currently in effect. Flight schedules are trending upward for July and August, with signatory airlines increasing flights and some international carriers resuming operation.
- Broward County Transit (BCT) service continues to operate at a reduced service level by operating a Saturday schedule Mondays through Saturdays – with normal scheduled service on Sundays. Bus schedules are available at <https://www.broward.org/BCT/Schedules>. Riders without a cloth face covering will not be allowed on BCT buses.
- The South Florida Regional Transportation Authority fares remain suspended until further notice.

ESF18: Business & Industry:

- The Federal Reserve has launched a Small Business Lending program called the Main Street Lending Program. The program is designed to help credit flow to small and medium-sized businesses that were in sound financial condition before the onset of the COVID-19 crisis, but now need loans to help maintain their operations until they have recovered from, or adapted to, the impacts of the pandemic. Loans originated under the program have several features that will help businesses facing challenges. **The program offers 5-year loans, with floating rates,** and principal and interest payments deferred to assist businesses facing temporary cash flow interruptions.

Key program details include:

- 1) Program offers 5 year loans (not a grant), with some deferred repayment terms.
 - 2) Open to US businesses with fewer than 15,000 employees or less than \$5 billion in revenue.
 - 3) Loan size can be \$250,000 - \$300 million.
 - 4) Can be applied for through approved private lenders listed on the Federal Reserve's website <https://www.bostonfed.org/supervision-and-regulation/supervision/special-facilities/main-street-lending-program/information-for-borrowers.aspx>.
- The application period for the Small Business Administration (SBA) Paycheck Protection Program will be ending. The application deadline is August 8, 2020.
 - Continuing to monitor and update business assistance information, identify banks and lending institutions that are participating in COVID-19 business financing programs and guide businesses to technical assistance resources. Businesses are being directed to the Office of Economic and Small Business Development (OESBD) website for the latest information.

- The SBA has reopened the Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) and EIDL Advance program portal to all eligible applicants still experiencing economic impacts due to COVID-19. The SBA's EIDL program offers long-term low-interest assistance for a small business or non-profit organizations. To keep payments affordable for small businesses, SBA offers loans with long repayment terms, up to a maximum of 30 years. Plus, the first payment is deferred for one year. Additionally, the EIDL Advance will provide up to \$10,000 (\$1,000 per employee) of emergency economic relief to businesses that are currently experiencing temporary difficulties, and these emergency grants do not have to be repaid. The EIDL program will remain open until the funds are depleted or until December 20, 2020.
- In July, the SBA South Florida District held two virtual panel chats with several Florida based-PPP lenders to discuss the process. According to data released by the SBA and Department of Treasury, more than 393,000 small businesses and organizations in Florida received \$32 billion in PPP loans, saving an estimated 3.2 million jobs.

Municipal Services:

- Municipalities are monitoring Potential Tropical Storm Nine and preparing to implement proactive measures should the storm threaten the region.
- Municipalities are currently involved in testing and feeding operations across the County in various sponsoring and support roles.
- Municipalities will continue to be contacted by the EDC warehouse if they have resource shipments ready for pickup.
- Municipalities are working on hurricane preparations and planning with COVID-19 precautions in mind.
- Municipalities are focused on submitting and revising resource requests, with critical resource requests being pushed to the State EOC.

Emergency Distribution Center (EDC) Unit:

- EDC is continuing to respond to tasks assigned for fulfillment and updating inventory as appropriate.

ESF 14: Public Information:

- Preparing a news release regarding Emergency Order 20-23, which is scheduled to be issued on July 29, 2020.

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- Preparing news releases announcing closure of some test collection sites due to the tropical weather system expected to impact South Florida over the weekend (July 30, 2020 through August 2, 2020).
- Providing daily updates to the County's Planning & Development Management's "Daily Weekday COVID-19 Update," a dashboard of key indicators including number of cases, positivity rates, hospitalizations, hospital capacities and deaths.
- Providing daily information updates to www.Broward.org/Coronavirus, including updates of testing collection site openings and closings.
- Coordinating the Municipal Public Information Officer Work Group to plan and implement a \$5 million public information and awareness campaign funded by CARES.
- Continuing to respond to media inquiries.
- The Broward County Call Center's COVID-19 Hotline continues to operate 7 days a week, from 8:00 AM until 10:00 PM and has received a total 40,204 calls since opening on March 21 2020; 7,139 calls in March; 8,073 in April; 4,672 in May; 7,707 in June; and 12,613 through July 28, 2020. July was a peak month for calls.

Recovery Branch:

- In anticipation of the impending tropical system impacting the area and associated possible flooding, it's important that (photo) documentation is made of pre storm conditions of vulnerable areas (e.g. roads, buildings, etc.) in the event of damage. In the event of flooding, both interior and exterior photos should be taken of waterlines. It is important that costs related to COVID-19 and a natural disaster are kept separate.

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Procurement/Supply Unit:

- Staff are preparing for sourcing requests in response to Phase 1 reopening activities. PSU team is sourcing for potential bulk purchase of PPE including masks, face and eye shields, gowns, coveralls, gloves, and hand sanitizer.

EOC Support Unit:

- EOC staff is monitoring and working on developing a staff schedule if needed to activate for Potential Tropical Storm Nine and continuing to support the Level 2 COVID-19 activation.

SUMMARY OF FUTURE ACTIONS

- Preparing BERT staffing schedule and assignments to implement protective actions for Potential Tropical Storm Nine should the storm continue to develop and threaten the region.
- Continue to work with the State to prioritize the resource requests for PPE for municipal first responders (Fire, EMS, LE) and health care facilities (hospitals and nursing homes).
- Coordinating with FDOH to implement expanded testing footprint in the County.
- Planning for EOC operations during the 2020 Atlantic Hurricane Season which started June 1, 2020. This planning includes, but is not limited to: 1) determining the minimum number of staff that need to physically be at the EOC to support a hurricane event while maintaining social distancing guidelines; 2) identifying positions that can be accomplished in a virtual environment; 3) planning for all other procedures and policies needed at the EOC to maintain safe operations during the Coronavirus outbreak.

ACTIVATION OBJECTIVES

- Continue implementing, in coordination with County Administration, County Elected Officials, and Local & State Leaders a phased reopening of Broward County services and businesses. This reopening is being accomplished in strict compliance with medical guidelines from the CDC and FDOH (all Sections).
- Continue processing resource requests from healthcare facilities (e.g., assisted living facilities, nursing homes, hospitals, etc.) and municipalities (First Responders), and submitting them to the state WebEOC (Operations/Logistics).
- Continue to coordinate logistical receiving, staging areas, and distribution for critical supply lines including personal protective equipment (PPE) to healthcare community, first responders, and municipalities (Logistics).
- Support in home testing and operations at drive through and walk-up testing sites (ESF8).
- Continue identifying needs for additional mass care support for ongoing and planned operations. This includes support to homeless populations, elderly populations, feeding operations (Human Services Branch).

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- Finalize a hurricane shelter contingency plan that will include non-congregate and congregate shelter options for general population, special needs, and pet-shelters. Promote State host Non-Congregate Sheltering program (Human Services Branch).
- Finalize EOC Activation Plan for 2020 Hurricane Season with safety procedures and EOC floor layout; maintain Level 2 EOC activation following social distancing protocols (all Sections).
- Continue timely and accurate information dissemination to stakeholders, decision-makers, and the public. Emphasize social distancing messaging (all Sections).
- Provide information to the public to prepare for the 2020 Hurricane Season while also protecting against the spread of COVID-19 (ESF14).
- Take all actions recommended by the CDC and DOH to protect yourself, your family, and your staff from contracting the COVID-19 virus (all Sections).

May 7, 2020	Broward County Emergency Order 20-09 expands upon Emergency Order 20-08 and clarifies operating procedures for golf courses, marinas, pools, and parks in compliance with CDC guidelines. Beaches remain closed.
May 14, 2020	Broward County Emergency Order 20-10 details Phase 1 reopening guidelines for Broward County. The order continues to require residents to utilize facial coverings and to keep a minimum distance of 6 feet when around other people. It allows restaurants and food establishments to provide on-site dining services at 50% capacity. It also allows essential businesses, retail establishments, barbershops and hair salons, outdoor movie theaters, fitness centers within housing developments, community and private club pools, as well as museums to reopen to the public at limited capacity. The order became effective on May 18, 2020.
May 16, 2020	Broward County Emergency Order 20-11 amends Emergency Orders 20-05 and 20-10 and clarifies that the emergency orders set minimum standards and that municipalities may establish more stringent standards, provided the standards do not conflict with existing state or federal orders. May 22, 2020	Broward County Emergency Order 20-13 extends Phase 1 reopening guidelines to beaches, commercial gyms and fitness centers, hotels and other commercial lodging, with restrictions, effective May 26, 2020.
May 29, 2020	Broward County Emergency Order 20-14 amends Emergency Order 20-12 regarding general requirements for all establishments, and limited reopening guidelines for both parks and beaches. The order became effective on June 1, 2020.

June 12, 2020	Broward County Emergency Order 20-17 details signage requirements for retail and restaurant establishments.
June 24, 2020	Broward County Emergency Order 20-18 outlines penalties, including immediate closures and fines, which can be imposed on establishments in violation of any Emergency Orders. This order becomes effective on June 26, 2020 at 12:01 AM.
June 29, 2020	Broward County Emergency Order 20-19 closes all beaches from July 3, 2020 through July 5, 2020 and specifies penalties associated with violations of this and previous Emergency Orders.
July 1, 2020	Broward County Emergency Order 20-20 restricting on-site consumption of alcohol and dining between 12:01 AM through 5:00 AM and defines rules for use of face masks.
July 8, 2020	Broward County Emergency Order 20-21 details new guidelines for establishments which are allowed to operate, provides additional guidelines for facial coverings, and penalties for failing to comply. The Emergency Order became effective at 12:01 AM on July 10, 2020.
July 17, 2020	Broward County Emergency Order 20-22 details new guidelines for individual responsibilities to limit spread of COVID19, details new curfew in effect from 11:00 PM through 5:00 AM, limits gatherings of people to less than 10, and gives operating guidelines for specific establishments.
